HMMWV Hummer

Marine Hummers are multipurpose vehicles that serve as command and control, troop transport, shelter carrier, armament carrier, and TOW (Tube-launched, Optically tracked, Wire-guided) missile system carrier

AAV P7 Assault Amphibious Vehicle

Designed to assault any shoreline from the well decks of Navy assault ships, AAVs are highly mobile, tracked, armored amphibious vehicles that transport Marines and cargo to and through hostile territory.

MV22 Osprey Aircraft

With the ability to carry 24 Marine combat troops twice as fast and five times farther than previous helicopters, the Osprey greatly enhances the advantages Marines have over their enemies.

MTVR (7-Ton Truck) Medium Tactical Vehicle Replacement

With an off-road mission profile and large cargo and crew compartment, the MTVR brings Marines and supplies to the fight fast, even in the most austere environments. The MTVR is also the primary mover of the M777.

LAV 25 Light Armored Vehicle

The Marine Light Armored Vehicle is able to operate on land and in water, carry communications equipment, and provide a weapons platform.

CH-53 Sea Stallion Helicopter

The Sea Stallion can carry a 26,000-pound LAV, 16 tons of cargo, or enough combat-loaded Marines to lead an assault or humanitarian operation. It is powerful enough to lift every aircraft in the Marine inventory except the KC-130 and is compact enough to deploy on amphibious assault ships. It has the armament, speed and agility to qualify as much more than a heavy lifter.

M1A1 Abrams Tank

The principal battle tank of the Marine Corps, the Abrams provides armor-protected firepower in support of Marine ground forces.

M777 Howitzer Cannon

The M777 Howitzer provides timely, accurate and continuous firepower in support of Marine Infantry forces.

HIMARS (High-Mobility Artillery Rocket System)

The Marines' most advanced artillery system, accurately engaging targets from more than 40 miles away and under all weather conditions.
